

**HOUSTON COUNTY SCHOOLS
REMOTE LEARNING COMPACT
GRADES 6-12**

All Houston County students and families are expected to adhere to expectations in the *Code of Conduct, Acceptable Use Policy*, and the *Houston County Revised Student/Parent Remote Learning Guide*. Any concerns, obstacles to learning, or questions pertaining to remote learning should be directed to building administrators before signing this compact.

Students will:

- Maintain passing grades and acceptable attendance rate in each enrolled course.
- Dedicate the time necessary for learning material for each class.
- Know and understand how to use necessary learning platforms as well as maintaining login information.
- Log in and participate daily during designated class times.
- Turn in work on time.
- Communicate with your teacher about concerns, obstacles to learning, or questions.
- Have your camera turned on at all times or be responsive through audio and/or posting.
- Attend required in-person meetings at school (e.g., intercession, testing).

Parents and Supporting Adults will:

- Provide a device or request a device acceptable for completing classwork.
- Ensure the device is used appropriately and maintained in good condition.
- Ensure that the student is turning in work that has been fully completed.
- Maintain communication via email and/or phone calls with school personnel as needed.
- Regularly check student grades via Skyward and join available learning platforms.
- Discuss school work with and encourage the student to complete the work on time.
- Do not post/share anywhere recorded images/videos of teaching. Do not record videos.

School staff will:

- Develop standards-based lessons for all students.
- Follow accommodations stated in IEP and 504 documents.
- Provide instructional resources and materials for all students.
- Communicate with parents/students about grades and develop a grade improvement plan as needed.

By signing below I am agreeing to the above expectations. **I understand if the student does not maintain passing grades and acceptable attendance, he/she may be required to return to in-person learning.** If a medical exemption is warranted, documentation from a medical doctor will be required to remain a remote learner as well as a meeting with the school administrator to develop a contract for grade/attendance improvement.
